- ► Sincere effort to include CSOs in the process and value their inputs
- ► Strengthening the civil society in line with the Strategy of cooperation between State Administration Bodies and NGOs 2022-2026

ANALYSIS OF THE PARTICIPATION OF CSO REPRESENTATIVES IN THE EU ACCESSION PROCESS: PRELIMINARY DATA

Questionnaire for the NGO representatives in the Working groups:

- ► Average satisfaction with the overall participation in the work of the Working groups (1-5): 2.88
- ► A quarter of the participants were informed of the activities and meetings of the working group in an adequate and timely manner.
- ► Satisfaction with the frequency of the meetings and work dynamic of the Working group (1-5): 2.4
- ► The overall conduct of the rest of the Working groups towards the NGO representatives and their opinions (1-5): 3.5

ANALYSIS OF THE PARTICIPATION OF CSO REPRESENTATIVES IN THE EU ACCESSION PROCESS: PRELIMINARY DATA

Questionnaire for the NGO representatives in the Working groups:

- ➤ On average, NGO representatives grade their capacities to work in the Working groups as slightly higher than those of the rest of the WG members (4.16 to 3.8).
- ► The NGO representatives have pointed out the need to revise the current mechanism in order to appoint members based on competencies rather than the amount of support.
- ► A need to inform the public more thoroughly through various channels of communication and updating the eu.me website has been outlined, in order to improve transparency.
